Course includes basic social and behavioral science concepts used in the analysis of police, courts, and correctional institutions; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

Also replaced SLS 1122 with CCJ 2452, Criminal Justice Administration; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

This modification will give students more options in how to tailor the program to match their career goals while continuing to prepare students for jobs in homeland security and criminal justice; **Effective Date:** Fall 2025 (202610).

2425-097 Homeland Security Specialist Certificate, CPM.......James McDonald Purpose: Homeland Security covers a broad area with a significant overlap with the criminal justice system. 2425-099 PLA 1058 Foundations of Law for Paralegals, CCA................C. Mestre Purpose: We are replacing BUL 2241 Business Law I as a required course in the Paralegal Studies degree with this new paralegal-specific Foundations of Law for Paralegals course. The new course will be taken after Introduction to Legal Practices and Ethics (PLA 1003C). While covering some of the same concepts as Business Law, the new course will be a legal specialty course will be more focused on workforce skills and require practical assignments aligned with our program outcomes. This new course incorporates Florida Department of Education requirements as well as American Bar Association requirements; **Credit/Contact/Lab Hours:** 3/3/0; **Prerequisites:** Satisfactory completion of all mandated courses in reading, English, and English for Academic Purposes and minimum grade of C in PLA 1003C; **Corequisites:** None; **Course Description:** This course provides paralegal students with an overview of tort law, constitutional law, criminal law, estate planning and probate administration, contracts, and family law. Students will prepare relevant legal documents relating to these areas of law; **Effective Date:** Fall 2025 (202610).

The prerequisites were changed to: Minimum grades of C in ENC 1101C and PLA 1003C.

Purpose: We would like to change the course number for our Intro to the Theme Park and Attraction Management to align with UCF Rosen College of Hospitality. The course description and learning outcome from our course are very similar to those of UCF's course, and the rationale for changing the course number is to make student transfer to UCF Rosen College of Hospitality Management seamless. This was requested in conversation with UCF Rosen by their Director of Student Services and Associate Dean. This is only a change in course number; to ensure seamless transfer, the same course number will be used by UCF; Credit/Contact/Lab Hours: 3/3/0; Prerequisites: None; Corequisites: None; Course Description: This course includes a comprehensive study of the theme park industry with an emphasis on management and operations. The course will examine theme park history, park design and development, attractions, entertainment, merchandising, food & beverage, and other services that support the theme park; Effective Date: Fall 2025 (202610).

Course will be equivalent to HFT 2756.

2425-106 HFT 2630 Security Issues in the Hospitality Industry, CCM........Craig Rap *Purpose:* This change is to update the course title to match the current topics covered. Including Risk Management in the title better describes the content and subject matter of this course, which has evolved over the past ten years to include more about risk management and mitigation strategies; *Revised Course Title:* Security Issues and Risk Management in the Hospitality Industry; *Revised Course Description:* This course provides an overview of contemporary security issues and risk management strategies within the various sectors of the hospitality industry, including lodging, restaurants, theme parks, and event and entertainment venues. Students will examine principles of crime prevention and learn to develop, implement, and assess effective security management programs. Additionally, students will learn about risk assessment, emergency response planning, and best practices to create a secure environment that ensures the safety of guests, staff, and property; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

2425-107 A.S. in Hospitality and Tourism Mgmt. (Articulated A.S. to B.S. Career Path), CPM......Craig Rapp

Purpose: We are updating the course number for HFT 2756, Introduction to Theme Park and Attractions Management, to HFT 2390 to match UCF and allow for seamless transfer. Note: you will also see a name change, adding "Risk Management" to the title of HFT 2630 Security Issues and Risk Management in the Hospitality Industry; **Effective Date:** Fall 2025 (202610).

Purpose: The technical certificate in Theme Park and Attractions Management TC, CPA.......Craig Rapp Purpose: The technical certificate in Theme Park and Attractions Management at Valencia College is designed to create both career and educational pathways. This 18-credit hour certificate could potentially be completed in one to two semesters and is accessible to anyone interested in advancing in the many areas that exist in theme park operations—from entertainment to transportation services. Additionally, it offers a pathway for someone who has never considered pursuing a college degree, as the 18 college credits earned can be directly applied to the A.S. in Hospitality Management at Valencia College. This program also includes an A.S. to B.S. pathway that allows students direct transfer to UCF Rosen College of Hospitality Management. This certificate is aligned with the Theme Park and Attractions Management Specialization. Note: this new program is being submitted pending state approval, submitted to the state by the November 1st deadline, at which time we will have a CIP assigned and we will update this. We don't forsee any problems with the state; Effective Date: Fall 2025 (202610).

2425-109 ANT 2410 Cultural Anthropology, CCM............Susan Dunn *Purpose:* Updated to remove GR writing and ENC 1101 pre-requisite language. Effective Fall 2025; *Revised Prerequisites:* None; *Revised Course Description:* Cultural anthropology attempts to explain the similarities and differences in human behavior, social institutions, and ways of life of all people, past and present, by studying living cultures worldwide. This course will examine how cultural anthropologists carry out research in order to understand the ways people live in groups, create culture and adapt to their environments. A variety of topics are covered including the concept of culture, culture change, human diversity, communication, marriage, economics, subsistence, globalization and human migration, kinship, politics and power, social organization, anthropological research and field methods, ethical issues in anthropological research, and the application of anthropological thinking to real world scenarios; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

2425-110 ANT **2410H** Cultural Anthropology-Honors, CCM.......Susan Dunn *Purpose:* Updated to remove GR writing and ENC 1101 pre-requisite language. Effective Fall 2025; *Revised Prerequisites:* None; *Revised Course Description:* Same as ANT 2410 with honors content. Honors program permission required; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

2425-111 AMH 2010 United States History to 1877, CCM.........Alyce Miller *Purpose:* Mandatory changes as determined by college leadership; *Revised Course Description:* In this course, students will examine united states history from before European contact to 1877. Topics will include but are not limited to indigenous peoples, the European background, the colonial period, the American revolution, the articles of confederation, the constitution, issues within the new republic, sectionalism, manifest destiny, slavery, the American civil war, and reconstruction. Gordon Rule course in which the student is required to demonstrate college-

level writing skills through multiple writing assignments. Minimum grade C required if AMH 2010 is used to satisfy Gordon Rule requirements; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

2425-112 AMH 2010H United States History to 1877-Honors, CCM........Alyce Miller *Purpose:* Mandatory changes as determined by college leadership; *Revised Course Description:* Same as AMH 2010, with Honors content. Minimum grade C required if AMH 2010H is used to satisfy Gordon Rule requirements; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

2425-121 POS 2041 U.S. Government, CCM.......A. Mathews Purpose: Mandatory changes as determined by college leadership; **Revised Course Description:** In this course, students will investigate how the national government is structured and how the American constitutional republic operates. It covers the philosophical and historical foundations of American government, including but not limited to the Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution and all its amendments, and the Federalist Papers. The course examines the branches of government and the government's laws, policies, and programs. It also examines the ways in which citizens participate in their government and ways their government responds to citizens. Gordon Rule course which requires demonstration of college level writing

skills through multiple assignments. Minimum grade of C required if used to satisfy Gordon Rule requirement; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

Mathews *Purpose:* Mandatory changes as determined by college leadership; *Revised Prerequisites:* None; *Revised Course Description:* In-depth study of state, county and municipal government with emphasis on contemporary problems; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

The following description is the approved state required description and after the meeting in the regular section of the course and the honors section.

This course provides a systematic introduction to the principles and institutions of American state and local government, with some emphasis on Florida politics. It delves into the structure, functions, and decision-making processes of the 50 states, including instruction on associated founding documents, and the more than 85,000 localities (governments) within those states. This course focuses on 1) the structure of state and local governments, 2) the social and political influences on states and local governments, and 3) the dynamics of administrative processes.

2425-123 POS 2112H State and Local Government-Honors, CCM............A. Mathews *Purpose:* Mandatory changes as determined by college leadership; *Revised Prerequisites:* None; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

Topics generally include: society and culture, institutions, socialization, influences, crime, change, groups, sex, race and ethnicity, family, class, and population; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).

2425-126 WOH 2012 World History to 1500, CCM........Alyce Miller *Purpose:* Mandatory changes as determined by college leadership; *Revised Prerequisites:* None; *Revised Course Description:* Survey of the evolution of civilizations from ancient times to the modern era (1500 AD/CE) with emphasis on political, social, cultural, and economic development as they evolved in the various areas. Examines the ancient world and ancient civilizations, classical antiquity, the early nation-states in the various areas around the globe, world religions emergence and development, developments through the first millennium common era, the European Renaissance, intersection and connection between global regions including the early age of Exploration, and other topics that explore the interactions among various civilization regions; *Effective Date:* Fall 2025 (202610).
