

THE AMERICAN UNIVERSITY OF ANTIGUA and VALENCIA COLLEGE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Valencia College and The American University of Antigua have agreed to the admission requirements outlined in this document.

WHEREAS, both parties are desirous of assuring qualified graduates of those programs of acceptance for admission to AUA in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, both parties agree as follows:

- 1. AUA will offer admission to its educational program leading to the Doctor of Medicine degree to graduates of Valencia College who meet the following requirements:
 - a. Complete an Associate in Arts Degree at Valencia College;
 - b. PLUS 30 additional credits including completion of AUA required pre-requisite courses as either part of the A.A. degree and/or as part of the 30 additional credits: (Appendix A)
- 2. In addition to completing the above requirements, a student also must meet the following minimum requirements in order to be admitted to AUA pursuant to this agreement:
 - a. An overall Grade Point Average of 3.25 or higher;
 - b. A Grade Point Average of 3.40 or higher in pre-requisite courses required by AUA;
 - c. Complete the requirements for the Career Action Healthcare Certificate as described in (Appendix B) currently under development at Valencia.
 - d. No more than one "F" or "D" grade in any pre-requisite course required by AUA. If candidate receives an "F" or "D" in a given pre-requisite class, he/she will have one opportunity to repeat the course and must earn a minimum passing grade of "A."

- e. No more than one "F" or "D" grade in any course for the Bachelor degree. If candidate receives an "F" or "D" in any course, he/she will have one opportunity to repeat the course and must earn a minimum passing grade of "A."
- f. A score of the National Average or higher on the Medical Admission Test. Only accepted students who are U.S. citizens, nationals or eligible permanent residents will be required to submit copies of their scores—listing all attempts. Canadian students and International students do not have to fulfill this requirement.
- g. A recommendation for admission by an AUA Admission Officer who has interviewed the applicant.
- h. A letter of recommendation from a Valencia Pre-Professional Program Advisor.
- 3. AUA will award a Bachelor's of Human Health Sciences Degree after the student successfully completes year 2 of the MD program.
 - a. The student must maintain a 2.00 grade point average in all course work at AUA;
 - b. The student must request to receive the BHHS degree through Desire Barnes by sending her an email after completing the four semesters (2 years) at AUA and requesting a review.
- 4. AUA represents that requirements for earning the M.D. degree are described in the AUA School of Medicine Catalog. AUA does not represent that students admitted pursuant to this agreement will be able to complete the degree requirements, but each student is responsible for planning his or her pre-medical education to develop skills necessary to succeed in a demanding professional degree program.
- 5. Valencia College will provide its students with information regarding this agreement and will arrange an information seminar to be offered by a representative of AUA not less than once each semester.
- 6. This agreement is effective beginning July 1^{st} , 2016 and continues so long as degree requirements for the Approved Programs do not change.
- 7. Valencia College and AUA will not, in the performance of this Agreement, discriminate on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, age, national origin, disability, gender, or other protected class as defined by the law applicable to each party., other legally protected classes.
- 8. Valencia College students who declare work toward this degree program will be permitted to complete at AUA should the agreement become void and discontinued for any reason.
- 9. Any and all notices or other communications required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if: (i) delivered by hand; (ii) sent by Federal Express or other commercial overnight courier; (iii) sent by telecopier, subject to confirmation of receipt; or (iv) sent postage prepaid by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, in any event addressed as follows:

- 11. Neither party shall assign its duties and obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.
- 12. This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding between the parties and no amendments or modifications shall be made to the Agreement, except in writing signed by both parties.


