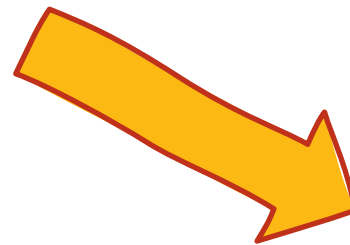

College level credits recommended by the American Council on Education (ACE) are also acceptable.

Temporary Certificate: For issuance of a five-year non-renewable Temporary Certificate covering Social Science (Grades 6-12), the following requirements must be completed, and official documentation must be submitted to the Bureau of Educator Certification:



If courses are listed as a requirement, EPI courses will meet the requirements listed on the Statement of Eligibility



Professional Certificate: For issuance of a Professional Educator's Certificate valid for five years covering General Science (Grades 5-9), the above requirements for a Temporary Certificate must be completed, and a CG-10 Application Form, appropriate non-refundable application fee, and official documentation of the following requirements must be submitted to the Bureau of Educator Certification:

- a passing score on the Professional Education Test earned no more than ten (10) years prior to the date of application.
- completion of a Florida approved Professional Education Competence Program administered and documented by your employer.
