The Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program at Valencia College is Limited-Access. Transcripts must be posted to your Valencia record before applying. Students using AP/IB/CLEP scores for prerequisites must request official scores from collegeboard.org (AP/CLEP) or ibo.org (IB).  <i>* Transfer students who are not considered “first-time in college” do not need to submit a high school transcript.</i></p> <p><b>Placement Testing:</b> Meet Valencia College entry testing requirements</p> <p><b>Student Success Coach:</b> Meet with a Student Success Coach to ensure you’ve met all requirements.</p>
Confirm Eligibility	<p>You must be a U.S. Citizen, U.S. Permanent Resident, or International Student.</p> <p><i>*International Students:</i> In addition to the required background check for clinical compliance (post-acceptance), a second background check from your home country is required. For concerns regarding this requirement, contact the <a href="#">Health Sciences Compliance Office</a>.</p> <p><i>*Individuals with DACA, Temporary Protection Status, Refugee, or Asylee status must complete the <a href="#">Employment Authorization Document</a> (EAD) before applying.</i></p> <p>Graduates will need a <b>Social Security Number</b> for NCLEX-RN licensure.</p>
Age Requirement	Must be 18 or older by the <u>start</u> date of all Health Sciences Programs
Allied Health Info Session	Virtual or in-person <a href="#">information sessions</a> are held each term to discuss the program requirements.

Transfer Courses	Transfer courses may need to be reviewed for potential course substitution or equivalency. This must be completed <u>before</u> submitting the program application. Transfer courses with ‘S’ or ‘P’ grades need to be reviewed for eligibility by the <a href="#">Health Sciences team</a>

## Program Course Requirement

The following points system is used to select eligible students. Student selection is based on the total number of points earned, overall GPA, Prerequisite GPA, and ATI TEAS Scores. All prerequisite courses must be completed by the application deadline with a grade of “C” or better. You may not repeat a course for grade forgiveness for which you previously earned a grade of A, B or C.

**Minimum Overall GPA Requirement:** 2.5

**Minimum ATI TEAS Requirement:** Composite Score of 58.7%

## How to Apply to the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program

Steps to Apply	Description
Submit a <u>Secondary Diagnostic Medical Sonography Application</u> .	1. Submit a General Valencia College Application. (This must be completed first. ( <i>Active students <b><u>are not required</u></b> to submit a General Admission Application.</i> )  2. Submit a Diagnostic Medical Sonography <u>Application</u>
Valencia Student Status	Your Valencia College Student Status <b>must</b> be “active” before submitting a secondary Sonography application
Log In to the Application	Use your MyVC username and password. You must complete the entire application.
Submit the Application	Pay the \$15 non-refundable application fee. The application is <b><u>NOT</u></b> complete until payment is received.

### What Happens After You Apply

**Application Review Process:** The application reviews will occur over 4-6 weeks after the closing deadline. Admissions are based on a competitive points system.

**Application Notification:** Your application decision will be sent to your MyVC email. You must monitor your email for updates. You will receive one of the following responses below:

### Requirements If Selected for Admission

**Mandatory Diagnostic Medical Sonography Orientation:** All accepted and alternate students must attend the Mandatory Diagnostic Medical Sonography Orientation, which is held before the program begins.

## CORE PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR ADMISSION AND PROGRESSION

Sonography is a practice discipline with cognitive, sensory, affective, and psychomotor performance requirements. Based on these requirements, the following list of "Core Performance Standards" has been developed. Each standard has an example of an activity, or activities, that a student will be required to perform while enrolled in the Sonography program. These standards are a part of each Sonography course and of the professional role expectation of a Sonographer.

For the Sonography Program, a qualified individual with a disability is one who, with or without reasonable accommodations or modifications, meets the essential eligibility requirements for participation in the program. Valencia College: School of Health Sciences makes no preadmission inquiries concerning an applicant's disability status. Information related to an applicant's disabilities is not a part of the information reviewed by the Admission Committee.

These Performance Standards should be used to assist students in identifying the academic and clinical expectations for all students. Criteria	Standard	Examples of Activities
<b>Critical Thinking</b>	Sound judgment and decision-making in clinical settings	Assess conditions from 20+ ft, evaluate images, initiate emergency care, adjust equipment.
<b>Interpersonal</b>	Ability to engage with diverse individuals respectfully	Show empathy, collaborate under stress, establish patient rapport.
<b>Communication</b>	Clear verbal and written English communication	Instruct patients, read charts, document care accurately.
<b>Mobility</b>	Move through clinical spaces and transport equipment/patients safely	Push/pull/lift 40 lbs., maneuver 500-lb machine, assist patient transfers.
<b>Motor Skills</b>	Fine/gross motor control for clinical procedures	Prolonged scanning, perform CPR, manipulate tools, input data.
<b>Hearing</b>	Hear verbal cues, alarms, and patient needs from a distance	Detect normal conversation and emergency sounds from 20 feet.
<b>Visual</b>	Sufficient acuity to observe, assess, and document	See small text, monitor patients, read equipment displays.
<b>Tactile</b>	Perform physical assessments and operate controls	Palpate for positioning, manipulate dials/switches.
