Program Course Requirement

The following point system is used to select eligible students. Student selection is based on the total number of points earned, and overall GPA. All prerequisite courses must be completed by the application deadline with a grade of "C" or better. You may not repeat a course for grade forgiveness for which you previously earned a grade of A, B or C.

Application Review Process: The application reviews will occur over 4-6 weeks after the closing deadline. Admissions are based on a competitive points system.

CORE PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR ADMISSION AND PROGRESSION

Respiratory Care is a practice discipline with cognitive, sensory, affective, and psychomotor performance requirements. Based on these requirements, the following list of "Core Performance Standards" has been developed. Each standard has an example of an activity, or activities, that a student will be required to perform while enrolled in the Respiratory Care Program. These standards are a part of each Respiratory Care course and of the professional role.

For the Respiratory Care Program, a qualified individual with a disability is one who, with or without reasonable accommodations or modifications, meets the essential eligibility requirements for participation in the program. Valencia College: School of Health Sciences makes no preadmission inquiries concerning an applicant's disability status. Information related to an applicant's disabilities is not a part of the information reviewed by the Admission Committee.

These Performance Standards should be used to assist students in identifying the academic and clinical expectations for all students. Students needing reasonable accommodations to fulfill required program outcomes or clinical expectations are encouraged to contact the Office for Students with Disabilities to engage in an interactive process regarding their request. It is the student's responsibility to notify and register with the Office for Students with Disabilities to identify and receive reasonable accommodations. Critical Thinking	Ability to make sound clinical decisions under pressure.	Analyze assessment data, identify cause- effect relationships, respond to emergencies, and solve problems.	
Interpersonal	Ability to work compassionately and effectively with diverse individuals.	Build rapport, manage stress, stay focused, and collaborate with patients and healthcare teams.	
Communication	Clear verbal and written communication in English.	Explain care, document accurately, read medical records, and use electronic systems professionally.	
Mobility	Ability to navigate and assist in clinical environments safely.	Move freely, reposition patients, and transport equipment without risk of injury.	
Motor Skills	Fine and gross motor control to provide effective respiratory care.	Draw medications, operate equipment, and assist with positioning patients.	
Hearing	Adequate hearing to ensure safe and responsive care.	Detect alarms, monitor patient sounds, and respond to verbal cues from a distance.	
Visual	Visual acuity for safe patient observation and accurate documentation.	Assess patients, detect subtle physical changes, and read printed and electronic records.	
Tactile	Tactile sensitivity for physical assessments and interventions.	Perform palpation, insert devices, and identify changes in skin condition or temperature.
