Program Information

Quick History

The complex healthcare needs of a growing and aging population increase the demand for baccalaureate-prepared nurses. To meet the ongoing needs of our community and experiential (clinical) partners for new BSN graduates, *Valencia College* (VC) began offering an *Online RN to BSN Program* (ORNBP) in 2018.

The BSN degree at VC provides an opportunity for the associates-level RN to further their potential for career advancement. The curriculum has a focus on research, leadership, and nursing education. Designed for working professionals, the program is completely online, except for completing CBE experiential learning (clinical hours) for NUR 3634C/Community and Public Health Nursing and NUR 4945C/Nursing Capstone.

In this program, through online discussion, group work, and other learning activities, you will further develop your mastery of these competencies, which are outlined in the Valencia College Catalog.

Think -- Critical thinking—an essential process for safe, efficient, and skillful clinical practice—enables health care professionals to:

- Collect and interpret diverse and multifaceted knowledge in various fluid situations and environments.
- Acknowledge an awareness of the limits of one's knowledge.
- Maintain an open mind in terms of different intervention methods.
- Analyze, synthesize, integrate, and evaluate information promptly with accuracy and efficiency in making decisions.

Value-- Making reasoned value judgments and responsible commitments are a part of being a health professional. With empathy and fair-mindedness, individually and in groups, a health professional needs to:

- Recognize values as expressed in attitudes, choices, and commitments among personal, ethical, aesthetic, cultural, and scientific values.
- Employ values and standards of judgment from different disciplines.
- Evaluate own and others' values from individual, cultural, and global perspectives.
- Articulate a considered and self-determined set of values.

Communicate—Effective skills and strategies for communication with different audiences using varied and appropriate methods (oral, written, visual/graphic, nonverbal) is essential in the medical field. In speaking, listening, reading, and writing, in verbal and non-verbal ways, with honesty and civility, in different disciplines and settings, health professionals need to:

- Identify their own strengths and need for improvement as a communicator.
- Employ methods of communication appropriate to the audience and purpose.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of own and others' communication.

Act—Medical professionals must integrate all their technical skills and knowledge in to act purposefully, reflectively, and responsibly in their personal and professional community. A health professional needs to:

- Apply disciplinary knowledge, skills, and values to the workplace and beyond.
- Implement effective problem-solving, decision-making, and goal-setting strategies.
- Act effectively and appropriately in personal and professional settings
- Assess the effectiveness of personal behavior choices.
- Respond appropriately to changing circumstances.

Program Admission Criteria

The BSN, ORNBP is designed for individuals who have completed a regionally or nationally accredited Registered Nurse (RN) program and hold an active unencumbered RN license or are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) within the first Term. The program provides an opportunity for RNs to further their education and increase their leadership potential for career advancement.

Program Requirements

The minimum number of hours to graduate with a BSN from VC is 120 credit hours. The ORNBP consists of general education courses, associate degree in nursing credit, foundation credit, and the core curriculum. Technology Requirements

All Online RN to BSN Program (ORNBP) courses use the Canvas learning management system (LMS), which can be accessed via Canvas Log In if you are an enrolled student.

If you are not enrolled, you can view the courses below or via the VC 2024-25 Catalog: BSN.

Canvas Help & Support

Once registered in the ORNBP, you must enroll in **Canvas 101.** Proficiency in Canvas is the minimum technical skill required for the course.

Canvas Mobile App: Canvas 101 provides information on installing the Canvas mobile app on your Android or Apple device.

ORNBP Educational Plan (Course Offerings)

There are two suggested educational pathways – the first pathway is if you completed an Associate of Arts (AA) degree prior to entering the ORNBP, and the second pathway is if you did not complete your AA prior to entering the ORNBP program and need to complete your AA with Valencia College.

Students can choose between a full-time or part-time educational plan. The full-time plan can be completed in one calendar year, while the part-time plan can be completed in 2 years (See Education Plan examples below).

Educational plans are based solely on ORNBP curriculum and do not include missing AA courses. Completion of the program may be extended if students need to complete AA requirements.

The ORNBP advisor will work with students on an individual basis to alter educational plans for extenuating circumstances. Students should be aware altered plans will result in delayed graduation because some courses are only offered during certain terms.

Terms are 8-weeks (Fall and Spring) and 6-week (Summer).

Your Valencia College catalog is valid for 5 academic years provided you are continuously enrolled as defined in the <u>catalog governing page</u>.

Prior to ORNBP - BSN graduation, all student transcripts will be audited to ensure all graduation requirements are met.

Academic Standards & Progression Policies

To maintain satisfactory academic progress at Valencia College (VC), you must achieve a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 each term. Successful completion of a course is defined as a grade of A, B, C, or D.

The student must earn a grade of "C" / 77% or better in all Online RN to BSN Program (ORNBP) Foundation and Core courses to successfully complete the BSN degree.

Program academic courses in which a student receives a grade lower than "C" will result in course failure. Students may be allowed to repeat courses for grade forgiveness.

Students in bachelor's degree programs at VC are limited to the number of attempts per course. Please see the VC Catalog for more information.

Before withdrawing from a course, it is best that students first discuss their course progress with their course faculty before contacting the BSN Program Advisor to determine how a withdrawal will affect career plans, education plans, and/or the status of financial aid.

Students demonstrating unsatisfactory academic progress will be subject to academic action, including Academic Warning, Academic Probation, and Dismissal from the program. Students have the right to appeal an academic action decision. The appeal process is found in the VC Catalog at the following link Student Appeal Process Instructions.

Attendance/Withdrawal (VC) Policy

Students are expected to participate regularly in all classes at least once/week for the course(s) in which they are registered. Regular participation in online courses is a significant factor that promotes student success.

Licensure Status Procedure

Your professional RN licensure must remain current throughout your enrollment in the ORNBP. At the beginning of the following courses: NUR 3825, NUR 3634C, and NUR 4945C, an official verification of your RN licensure status must be documented. You will obtain verification by using the Nursys Website and select the QuickConfirm License Verification option.

During the NUR 3825 course, you are required to submit your current and unencumbered RN license. If you do not have a license or provide proof of an NCLEX date within your first Term, progression in the program is placed on hold. Proof of current and unencumbered RN licensure is reevaluated at the beginning of NUR 3634C and NUR 4945C.

If at any time your license expires, or if you are obligated to surrender your license, you must inform us of your change of status. It is your responsibility to report this to the Valencia College (VC) Nursing Dean and the BSN Program Advisor.

Experiential Learning (Clinical)

A total of 25 hours is required for Experiential Learning in the ORNBP and will occur in NUR 3634C & NUR 4945C. NUR 3634C requires the student to complete total of 15 hours for experiential learning and NUR 4945C requires the student to complete a total of 10 hours for experiential learning. The focus of Experiential Learning is to emphasize direct & indirect learning activities for all 4 spheres of care and across the lifespan. The 4 spheres of care are:

- 1. Well-Being/Disease Prevention
- 2. Chronic Disease care
- 3. Regenerative or Restorative Care and
- 4. Hospice/Palliative/Supportive Care

Experiential Learning activities culminate with the student creating a community, population health promotion project in NUR 3634C. In NUR 4945C, the students will implement and evaluate the NUR 3634C project.

Online RN to BSN Program (ORNBP) faculty supervise NUR 3634C & NUR 4945C students throughout their experiential learning assignments.

Experiential Learning Attire

When conducting ORNBP Experiential Learning activities in the community, students will wear personal scrubs without logos and a white lab coat or professional dress attire and have visible on their clothing the VC student identification badge.

Degree Audit

Your degree audit identifies the course requirements for your program and indicates which of these courses you have completed, including the foreign language and General Education requirements; the audit excludes all courses not counted in the program.

It is recommended that you run your degree audit at least once per term, after grades have been processed, to check your progression to your degree. To run your degree audit, follow these steps:

- 1. Log onto Atlas
- 2. Click Students tab at the top
- 3. Scroll down to Path to Graduation
- 4. **Select #1** My Academic Progress (Degree Audit)
- 5. Select Term: Select current or next term
- 6. The next screen should show your degree
- 7. Click Generate New Degree Audit

- 8. Select Term: Select the term you began the BS degree
- 9. Click your major
- 10. Click Generate Request

Graduation

At the end of Spring & Fall Terms, Valencia College (VC) graduating students can participate in the annual commencement ceremony. Graduates from the preceding Summer and Fall Terms can participate in the Spring Term graduation ceremony.

At the beginning of each term, there is a graduation application deadline for students who plan to graduate at the end of that term. To graduate, you must submit a successful graduation application by the specific deadline listed in the Important Dates and Deadlines Calendar on the VC <u>Academic Calendar</u> webpage. To apply:

- 1. Sign into Atlas
- 2. Click the Students Tab at the top
- 3. Scroll down to Path to Graduation
- 4. Click on the Graduation Application
- 5. Complete and submit the Graduation Application

White Coat Pinning Ceremony (WCPC)

At the end of every Term, the Online RN to BSN Program (ORNBP) graduates participate in the WCPC. The WCPC is a rite of passage that serves to elevate the BSN graduate nurses' value of humanism as the core of healthcare. The ceremony provides a powerful emphasis on compassion in combination with scientific excellence. Included in the ceremony are important components for the *rite of passage*, which are the graduate *donning the white lab coat*, attaching the *earned BSN Pin* to the white lab coat, and *collectively reciting* the *White Coat Oath*.

ORNBP Transient Student Procedure

VC has a Community Partners (CP) with Seminole State College and Lake Sumter State College. Each institution has online RN to BSN programs that offer electives, and students from any of the Community Partners (CP) may take these electives, or other courses, as transient students. Below are the ORNBP electives that are currently offered:

<u>Important Financial Aid Information</u>: If the student is using financial aid, the student will need to pay out of pocket at the transient college and then receive reimbursement when financial aid is distributed at the home institution. The student must indicate they plan to use financial aid when completing the transient student application.

<u>Note</u>: The student should start the transient student process approximately eight (8) weeks prior to the start of the term in which they plan to take the course. The student should review the transient college's website information on transient admission requirements.

<u>Difficulties</u>: If the student has difficulty with the process, such as receiving an error message or being unable to enroll once given final approval, they should contact the BSN Program Advisor or appropriate BSN administrator at their home institution for assistance. The BSN Advisor or appropriate administrator may reach out to their counterpart at the transient institution to facilitate the student's enrollment.

Canvas: The student will have a separate Canvas account at each enrolled institution.

Eligibility to be a Transient Student

- 1. Be an active, degree-seeking student at the home institution
- 2. Be in good academic standing
- 3. Have completed at least one credit hour at the home institution
- 4. Prove that all course prerequisites have been met (In progress course prerequisites do not count)
- 5. Have no holds on the student record
- 6. Students may not be transient during the term of graduation

Transient Student Application Process

Information needed:

- Atlas username and password
- Name of institution where the elective will be offered (i.e., Seminole State College)
- Course prefix, number, and title (i.e., NUR 4886 Critical Care Nursing)
- Term and year when you want to take the course (i.e., Spring 2024)
- Check the college's website to ensure the desired course is being offered for the term
- Social Security Number (If you don't have a Social Security Number, please enter nine zeros.)

Submit Transient Student Application

- 1. Visit www.floridashines.org
- 2. Select: Get Started and Take a Course at another school
- 3. Select: Apply or Check Application Status Now
- 4. Select: Valencia College as your college
- 5. Enter your Student ID and Password (Atlas username and password)
- 6. Select: Submit
- 7. Select: *Campus and Program*
- 8. Complete the transient application be sure the course information is accurate
- 9. Click to sign (Electronic signature)
- 10. Click Send

Approvals

The application will be sent electronically to Valencia College (VC). After VC approves the application, it will be sent electronically to the institution where you want to take the course. During this process, you will receive updates on the status via email from the institutions. While Florida Virtual Campus doesn't control the application process, you can check the status of your application at any time by logging into the Transient

Student Admission Application. It can take up to 10 days, on average, for the institutions to process an application.

If your application is accepted, you will receive an email notification from the transient institution that may include special information about the next steps, including information about an admissions application fee, if any. Your home institution and the institution where you will take the approved course will work together to confirm enrollment, release financial aid, and obtain your grades at the end of the course. If your application is denied, please contact the person who denied the application for more information. Contact information is included in the email you receive.

After completing course

It is the student's responsibility to request, from the Transient Institution, an official copy of their transcript to be sent to Valencia College's (VC) <u>Admission and Records Office</u> after completion of the term.

Academic Integrity

The requirements and standards for nursing are directly related to the responsibility that the Nursing profession requires in the care of patients and their families. Based on the level of responsibility and ethical practice, the profession of nursing has an established level of professionalism and conduct. This is outlined as a part of the standards of professional practice of the American Nurses Association (ANA) Code of Ethics.

The ANA defines professionalism as the consistent demonstration of core values evidenced by nurses working with other professionals to achieve optimal health and wellness outcomes in patients, families, and communities. Professional Nurses demonstrate this professionalism through applying the principles of altruism, excellence, caring, ethics, respect, communication, and accountability. Professionalism also involves personal accountability in personal actions, behavior, and nursing practice. This includes continuous professional engagement in exemplary practice and lifelong learning.

Students with Disabilities Policy

VC is interested in making sure all our students have a rewarding and successful college experience. For that reason, Valencia students can get immediate help with issues dealing with stress, anxiety, depression, adjustment difficulties, substance abuse, time management, as well as relationship problems dealing with school, home, or work. BayCare Student Assistance Services are available to all Valencia students and available 24 hours a day by calling (800) 878-5470.

Students with disabilities who qualify for academic accommodations must provide notification from the Office for Students with Disabilities (OSD) and discuss specific needs with the instructor, preferably during the first two weeks of class. Academic Dispute Procedure

This ORNBP procedure is a combination of *Valencia's College-wide Student Academic Dispute and Administrative Complaint Resolution Policy* and the *ORNBP Academic Dispute Procedure* below.

The *ORNBP Academic Dispute Procedure* was created to address any informal and formal disputes regarding an academic instructor, course, experiential site, and/or non-academic matters (discrimination, harassment, and related misconduct). The following define *informal* vs. *formal* complaints:

• Informal:

Academic or non-academic dispute that a student has with a faculty/instructor, staff member, administrator, or department/program.

1. All disputes begin informally unless sexual misconduct or discrimination.

• Formal:

A dispute is not resolved informally & the student wishes to continue the process, then the student must:

- 1. Submit an email dispute request to the Nursing Dean or the Deans' designee or
- 2. Complete the appropriate information on the Ombudsman webpage.

Any student who feels there is an informal or formal academic or non-academic dispute *regarding a nursing course* shall follow the reporting procedure below:

- 1. Student must communicate & attempt to resolve the dispute with whomever the issue arose, if possible.
- 2. If the dispute remains unresolved, contact the Nursing Dean or identified designee to mediate toward a resolution.
- 3. If the dispute continues to be unresolved informally, the Nursing Dean, in conjunction with the student will make the decision on whether the dispute is formal.

If the student is dissatisfied with the academic resolution and decision following their dispute, the student must follow the *Valencia College Policy on Student Academic Dispute and Administrative Complaint Resolution* identified above.

Chain of Command for Student Dispute



NOTE: If a student's dispute is related to an individual in the above chain of command, then it is advised that the student contact the next person in the chain of command or express their concern through the Student Dispute Resolution webpage.

• Any student can submit an email dispute request to the Nursing Dean or the Deans' designee **or** <u>express</u> <u>your concern</u> to initiate the student dispute process at any time.

NOTE: Initial communication regarding a student's performance or academic standing should be between the course faculty/administrators and the individual student. Students are expected to communicate their own concerns and not defer to others to communicate on their behalf. Legal, ethical, and professional protocols limit the information that can be shared by the faculty with anyone other than the student (<u>FERPA Policy</u>). In the event the student should require additional individuals to be present or in any other manner, the student must sign a release form specifically for the individual with whom the information is to be shared.

Confidentiality and Use of Electronic Devices (VC) Policy

Privacy Rights of Students

FERPA stands for Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Passed by Congress in 1974, the Act grants 4 specific rights to college students. In the Florida Statutes, <u>Section 1002.22</u> substantially enacts provisions of FERPA as a matter of state law, with minor variations. <u>VC Student Records Policy</u> contains policies and procedures related to the implementation of these laws:
