Outdoor exercise equipment allows students to use time between classes to improve their health, even if via short 10 or 15-minute workouts. The state has instructed applicants to prepare this year’s proposal based on an extension of previously submitted five-year plans. Funding will support services related to recruitment, retention, completion, and placement of students, professional development, career pathways, and will continue to focus on non-traditional student recruitment.
