

Downtown Center for Accelerated Training

- Valencia College was awarded a \$2.3M Florida Job Growth Grant by the Governor and the Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) in 2018.
- The grant provided \$1M for renovation, \$1M for equipment and \$320K in student scholarship support.
- Valencia College leased a 4300 sq. ft. property at 400 Pittman St. near the Downtown Campus.
- Additional grant donations were received to support student scholarships from entities such as Lockheed Martin and the City of Orlando.
- Continual student support by CareerSource Central Florida for these programs.
