Two priorities remain our focus:

- The health and safety of our employees and students
- Ensuring the continuity of student learning

Created with feedback from employees, students, Orlando Health Business Ready Task Force, and with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines (especially those that pertain to reopening higher education facilities)

The majority of students and employees will continue remote engagement/work to:

- enable physical distancing
- reduce population density on campus locations
- provide for the health and safety of our community

Student and learning support services will continue to be available for students to access online.

Currently considering how we can better support employees who are experiencing significant hardships in working from home





Employees and students who will be on-site in phase 2 will:

- Conduct a daily health self-assessment and remain at home should they not feel well
- Wear a face mask that meets CDC guidelines while on campus (if needed, the college will provide one)

Illness reporting, contact tracing, and deep cleaning/sanitation protocols are fully deployed to limit virus spread when an individual with a positive COVID diagnosis has been onsite.

Isolation for COVID-19 positive individuals, quarantine for close contacts, and notification for potential contacts are coordinated and monitored by Valencia's COVID case manager.



Phase 2 experience



As of October 21, 2020:

- 38 cases student or employee with a positive COVID-19 diagnosis who has been onsite
- Since August, only one class required to be quarantined due to close contacts
- Compliance with safety protocols has significantly reduced the need to disrupt educational experiences for students and faculty
- Deep support and flexibility from faculty for students who are either quarantined or ill



Phase 2 Course Schedule Recommendation




Given the College's plans to remain in Phase 2, a Design Team of faculty and deans recommended that the college restrict the option of face-to-face or mixed-mode offerings for Spring 2021 only to those courses that:

- cannot be delivered in an online format;
- are part of a program in which students' progression has been delayed because course outcomes require a face-to-face component; or,
- utilize specialized equipment or software that is only available on campus.




Online and Face-to-Face Course Success
