WHEN CAN I GET THE VACCINE?

All Florida residents are now eligible to receive any COVID-19 vaccine as prescribed by the Food and Drug Administration.

Individuals Under 18: The Pfizer vaccine is authorized for persons age 16 and up. All individuals under the age of 18 receiving a vaccine must be accompanied by a guardian and must complete the COVID-19 vaccine screening and consent form

Citizenship is not an eligibility requirement for the vaccine. Students have to show only proof of Florida residence by showing a Florida driver's license or state ID card. If they don't have either one of these, they need to provide two documents as proof of temporary residence, such as a rental agreement, utility bill no more than two months old, or mail from a financial institution or a government agency.

WHAT DOES THE PROCESS LOOK LIKE?

- 1. Before you arrive, contact the site where you will be vaccinated or review your appointment confirmation email
- 2. When you get a vaccine, you and your healthcare provider will both need to wear masks that cover your nose and mouth
- 3. You should receive a paper or electronic version of a fact sheet that tells you more about the specific COVID-19 vaccine you receive.
- 4. After getting a COVID-19 vaccine, you should be monitored on site for at least 15 minutes.
