Programs within the School of Allied Health include Associate in Science degrees in cardiovascular technology; dental hygiene; diagnostic medical sonography; emergency medical services; health information technology; radiography; and respiratory care. Bachelor of Science degrees are also offered in cardiopulmonary sciences and radiologic and imaging sciences.

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HIGHLIGHTS

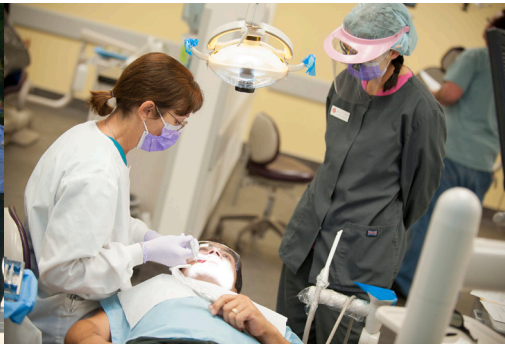

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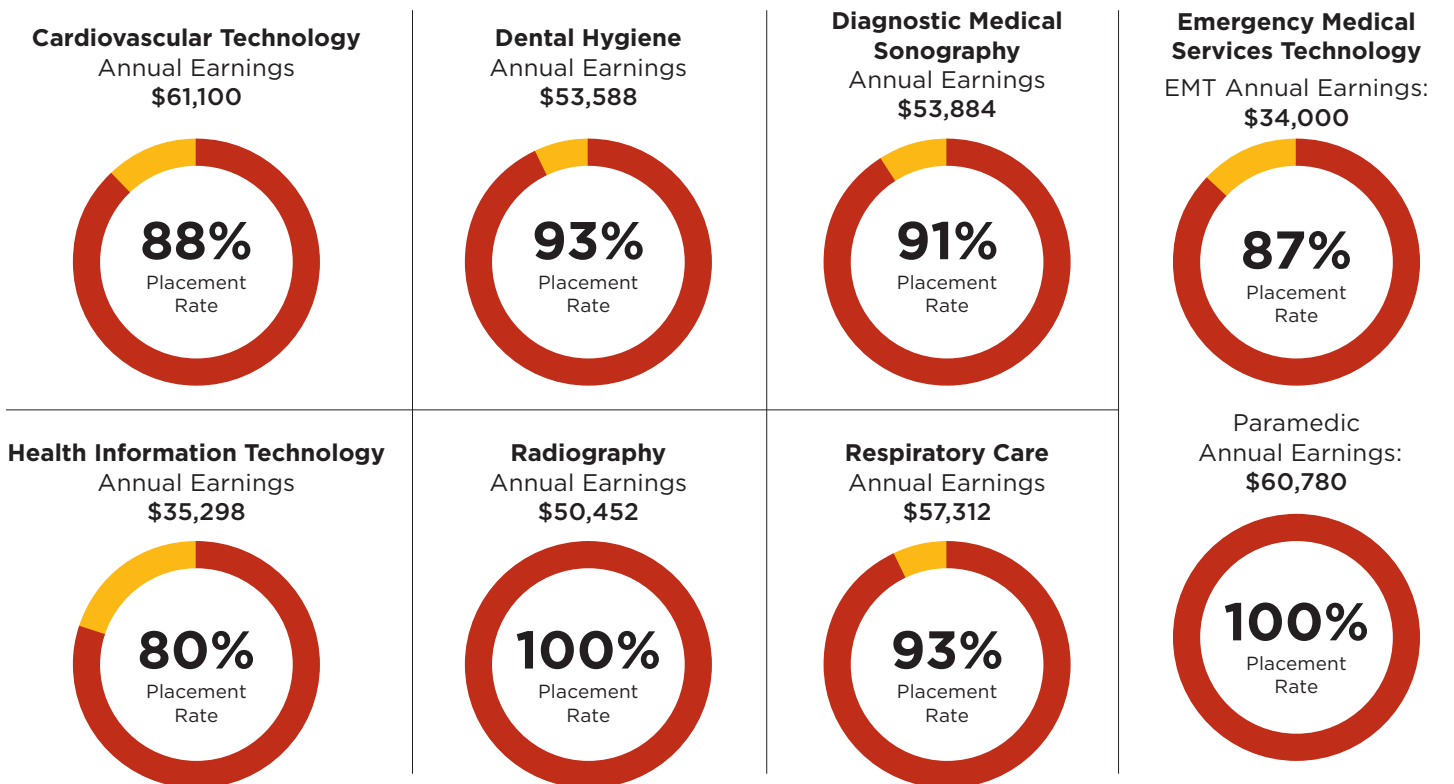


Dental Hygiene

ANGELA MURPHY

Angela Murphy spent most of her adult life working in a dental office, making little more than minimum wage. But when she decided to go to college, she discovered it wasn't too late to live her dreams.

In 2012, Angela found herself at a dead-end, having worked as an office clerk for decades. After 30 years of experience, Angela was being paid \$11 per hour and wasn't happy. She knew she wanted to help people, so she began researching schools and programs that would help her achieve her dreams. That same year, she began her educational journey at Valencia. As a 51 year-old, non-traditional student, Angela was terrified.

In the summer of 2014, Angela was accepted into Valencia's cardiovascular program and worked hard to
