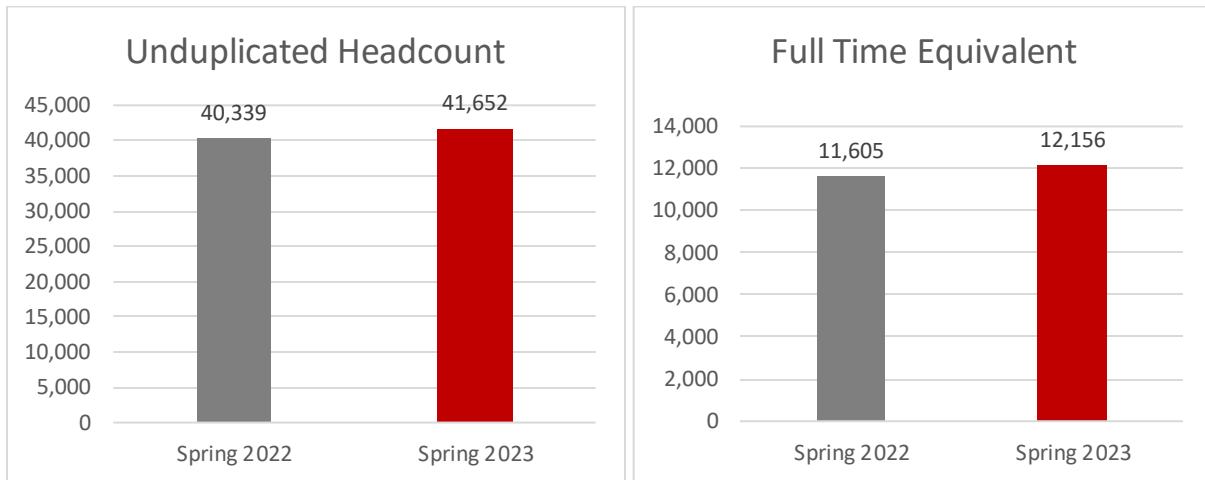


# VALENCIA COLLEGE

## Spring 2023 Enrollment Report

### Headcount/FTE Comparison

The total number of students enrolled at Valencia increased 3.3% from Spring 2022 to Spring 2023, and full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment (a measure of credit hours) increased 4.7% from last spring.



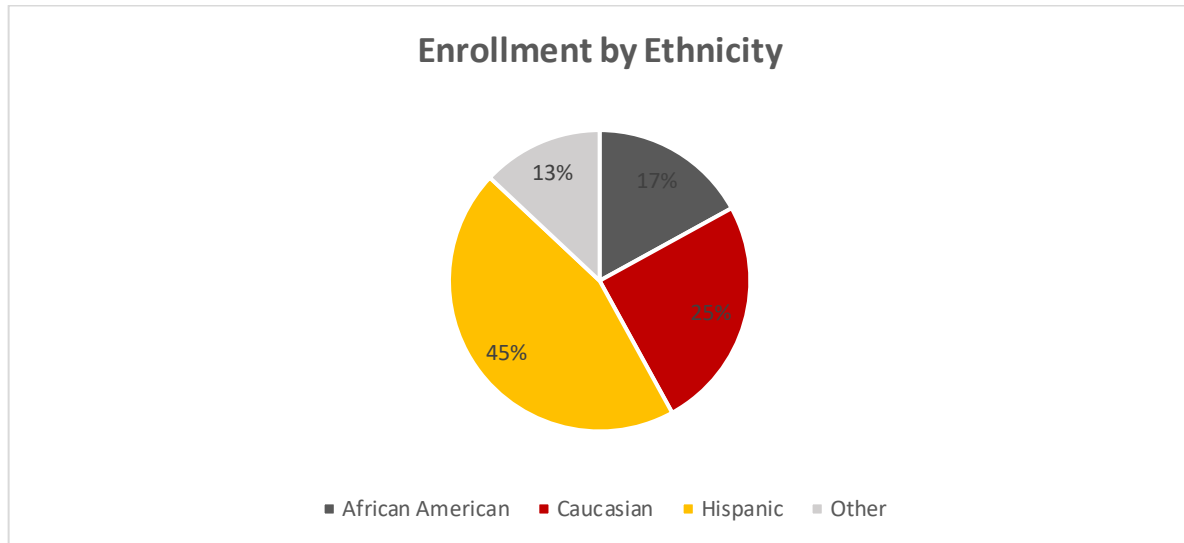
### Enrollment by Student Type

We continue to see strong enrollment across the primary student types of First-Time-in-College (FTIC), Returner, and Transfer. The largest percentage increase (16.8%) was in FTIC student enrollment. However, the largest sector of enrollment continues to be returner students, which accounts for nearly 72% of our overall enrollment each term.

## Enrollment by Ethnicity

Hispanic student enrollment is at 45% for spring 2023. For comparison, Hispanic student enrollment comprised approximately 42% of enrollment for Spring 2022. Spring 2023 enrollment shows a 16% enrollment increase of Hispanic students from Osceola County and a 7% increase from Orange County.



## Enrollment by Modality

While the headcount for online enrollment remains very high (approximately 54% of overall enrollments), there were substantial increases in enrollment in mixed mode and onsite classes. Mixed mode and onsite enrollment account for approximately 43% of overall spring enrollment.
