"As a long-term unemployed woman, I live under conditions of extreme poverty. I was going to be homeless by the end of the month and my life was pretty bleak. My classes at Valencia were some of the few good things going on in my life, but I struggled to keep up with my classes. The worry about a roof over my head and sometimes just being hungry are some of the obstacles to success that I have been dealing with. There is no curriculum to teach one how to survive and escape poverty, so I am doing the best I can."

Deborah realizes one strong tool in the struggle against poverty – education. She continues to work hard at Valencia and stays active in the community. Her ultimate goal is to become an electrical engineer specializing in renewable energy and work in the hospitality industry.

"I am slowly making progress personally and at Valencia. I strive to maintain good grades and two of my nonfiction stories that I submitted to *The Phoenix* were selected as first and second place winners for 2013. You have no idea how much your scholarship means to me and I will spend my scholarship wisely."
