ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF VALENCIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOUNDATION, INC.

PREAMBLE

The undersigned subscribers and incorporators hereby associate themselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation for scientific, educational and charitable purposes under Florida law and do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of this non-profit corporation shall be VALENCIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOUNDATION, INC., bereinafter referred to as "Foundation".

ALTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose for which this Foundation is formed are:

(a) To foster interest in Valencia Community College; to provide leadership in the promotion of its scientific and educational services; to promote its welfare; to pusist it in fulfilling its objectives; to implement the total program of activities of the college in appropriate ways; and, to otherwise assist, aid, and advance the activities and services of Valencia Community College as it serves the citizens of Florida.

- (b) To enter into, make, and perform contracts and agreements; to purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, lease, encumber, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge, exchange or otherwise dispose of any real, personal, or intangible personal property in the same manner and to the same extent as a natural person might do.
- (c) To encourage, solicit, administer and accept gifts of both real and personal property or money for scientific, educational and charitable purposes, all for the advancement of Valencia Community College; to sue and defend, to lend and borrow money, giving promissory notes or bonds where necessary; and to secure payment thereof by mortgage or deed of trust or to loan money upon or without security.
- (d) To receive bequests and devises by will absolutely or in trust to the same extent as a natural person.
- (e) To make gifts in the form of scholarships to aid students and to make gifts and grants to Valencia Community College and any of us staff, instructors or departments for the purposes outlined herein.
- (f) To carry on or engage in any activity of any nature whatsoever which the Foundation may deem proper or convenient in connection with the stated purposes and to use any and all of its assets from whatever source obtained, either the principal or income therefrom, either immediately or in the future, for the furtherance of the Foundation's purposes.
- (g) To use assets and earnings of the Foundation exclusively for the purposes hereinabove set out, including the payment of expenses incident hexeto, and to use no part of the net earnings to the benefit of any private

member or individual. No substantial parts its activities shall be for the carrying on of proagands or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Foundation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP

All persons making a contribution to the foundation shall become members of the Foundation and enjoy privileges as determined by the Board of Directors of the Foundation.

ARTICLE IV

TERM OF EXISTENCE

The Foundation shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE V

DIRECTORS, EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND OFFICERS

Section 1. Board of Directors

The affairs of the Foundation shall be managed by a Board of Directors of not less than ten (10) directors. Their number, qualifications, terms of office and manner of selection shall be fixed by the By-Laws. The President of Valencia Community College and a representative of the District Board of Trustees of Valencia Community College shall at all times be members of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Executive Committee

Executive Committee of not less than five (5) members of the Board of Directors and may authorize such committee to exercise all or part of the powers and authority of the Board of Directors. The President of Valencia Community College and the President of the Board of Directors shall be members of the Executive Committee. The Executive Director shall be a non-voting ex officio member of the Executive Committee.

Section 3. Officers and Executive Director

The officers of the Foundation shall be President, Vice President, Secretary and/or Treasurer as the Board of Directors may from time to time elect. The officers and the Executive Director shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors, each to serve for one (1) year, or until an election of a successor. The offices of President and Vice President of the Board of Directors shall be filled from the membership of the Board of Directors. The offices of Secretary and/or Treasurer may be held by the same person.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Number, Qualifications, Terms of Office, Manner of Selection, Ex Officio Members.

The number, qualifications, terms of office, manner of selection and ex officio members of the Board of Directors of the Foundation shall be as follows:

Purpose: Course revision due to Cardiovascular Technology and Respiratory Care program requirements; one of the current catalog math prerequisites is not offered at Valencia anymore; Revised Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C in MAC 1105 or higher; Revised Catalog Course Description: One-semester course for health-related majors, primarily those entering Valencia's Cardiovascular Technology and Respiratory Care programs. Survey of topics in physics related to health field. Applications of physics to principles of mechanics, heat, light, sound, electricity and magnetism, and radioactivity as they apply to health field. May not be taken for credit subsequent to receiving grade of C or better in any higher physics course. (Special Fee: \$63); Effective Date: Fall 2013 (201410).

Proposal numbered 1112-181 was approved by consensus.

4. Information Items

House Bill 7135: Relating to Postsecondary Education – Karen Borglum will review a
PowerPoint presentation from the Florida College System Webinar she attended regarding
HB 7135. This bill, among other things, will change the required number of general education
hours for students seeking an A.A. degree, beginning for students entering college in
2014/2015.

The original Agenda had House Bill 7135 as the last item on the Agenda. Karen suggested that it be moved prior to the Discussion Item; some of the CCC members had already been involved in the CLC discussion of the AA/General Education Program Review, and if they wanted to leave prior to that discussion today, this would allow them to do so.

Karen said that this bill will be very important over the next year. In particular, due to the changes that will happen within General Education, it will impact the work that we do. The bill was presented to the House in March and was approved; following was approval by the Senate. The governor has, within the past week, signed the bill into law.

Karen did a review of each of the pertinent changes. She said that Section 3 is probably in response to certain colleges that gave students an inordinate number of course substitutions. This caused "artificial" degrees to be awarded; "artificial," because the degrees were not based on the courses required for the specific degree, due to the substitutions. The goal seemed to be to raise the number of degrees awarded.

Karen summarized Section 10, pertaining to General Education - a faculty committee will be put together by the State Board of Education and the Board of Governors to determine five core courses under each of the main general education subject areas. Students will be required to complete at least one of these courses in each subject area. There will then be a list that can be determined by each college (giving some flexibility) that students can choose from in order to complete the total required number of general education hours. In addition, general education requirements will decrease from 36 hours to 30 hours.

Faculty from various colleges will be selected to serve on the committee appointed by the SBE and BOG. It is anticipated that colleges will strongly desire to have faculty serve on this committee, since faculty own the curriculum.

Wendy asked if there is something that we can do to be proactive - Karen said that it will be important to look at the college's degree programs and common prerequisites, to begin with; as well as the general education core. She has already begun doing "lead-in" work to prepare for the work to come.

Additional topics that will be covered include weapons of mass destruction, transportation and border security, legal and ethical issues, sources of terrorist threats and natural hazards, risk assessment and mitigation, the National Incident Command System (NIMS), intelligence and security analysis. Moreover, students will be able to select from prescribed list of criminal justice electives in order to tailor the certificate to their particular interest; Effective Date: Spring 2012 (201220). Students currently enrolled in TSA courses will be able to earn this TC for the Spring Term, if this program is approved.

Proposal 1112-180 was approved by a vote of 13 yes votes and 1 no vote.


• Polysomnography Technology, ATC, CPM (Jamy Chulak) - Jamy presented the Cardiopulmonary B.S. degree program to the CCC April, 2011. At that time, he obtained approval to re-level the polysomnography courses in the ATC from 1000/2000 level TO 3000/4000 level. In addition, the

program sheet with the markups was included. However, the Credit Program Modification form was inadvertently left out, and it was not noticed at the time.

Since those changes were clearly intended as evidenced by all of the related work done, the changes have already been incorporated into the 2012-13 Catalog, and the CPM form has been done as a matter of record, for the files.

- Cardiopulmonary Sciences, A.S. to B.S. Degree This program was approved April, 2011, and was scheduled to begin Fall 2012. However, due to Valencia being in the midst of its reaffirmation process, SACS will not give final approval. Therefore, the program will not be able to start, as planned, and will be moved to a later start date, to be determined.
- PHY 2048H (General Physics with Calculus I) This course was approved October, 2011, with a
 prerequisite of MAC 2312; however, it was later noted that the prerequisite for PHY 2048C is MAC
 2311. For consistency, the prerequisite for PHY 2048H will be changed to match the non-Honors
 course.
- Seneff Honors Program The lengthy application process for the Seneff Honors Program has been
 revised to facilitate the process for those students who wish to earn an Honors Certificate or take
 Honors Program classes without being admitted into the Seneff Honors College, as stated below:
 (Revised Catalog Template and Revised Honors Online Application attached)
 - (1) Students who have applied and have been approved to take honors classes may take **up to 12 credit hours** of honors work without being admitted to the James M. and Dayle L. Seneff Honors College. (Current requirements state that they may take up to 9 credit hours without being admitted.)
 - (2) Students may **graduate with an Honors Certificate** without being admitted to the James M. and Dayle L. Seneff Honors College. (Current requirements state that they must apply and be admitted to earn an Honors Certificate.)
 - Medical Office Support w/Specializations, TC (Betty Wanielista) This program modification was approved at the January, 2012 meeting. Previously, there was a Medical Office Support Technical Certificate, and it was determined that course substitutions were being done frequently to allow OST 1467. It was hoped that by adding these specializations, there would be no need for the course substitutions.

However, upon further examination, it was found that the same course was being used for both specializations, so there was nothing unique about them. They will not be placed in the Catalog, and the department will look for another way to resolve the substitution issue.

Per Florida Statute 274.02, equipment with a cost or fair market value of \$1,000 or more and a projected useful life of more than one year must be recorded in the financial records as property for inventory purposes. Therefore, original cost reflects the cost of the item at the date of acquisition, or the estimated fair market value at the date received, in the case of gifts.

Equipment is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the following estimated useful lives:

- Vehicles, office machines, educational equipment five years
- Furniture seven years
