Over 1,000 students qualify for both SSS eligibility and also have developmental academic needs. The College's LinC (Learning in Community) model will be used and will intentionally draw on the power of first year college success by creating a robust learning community, including academic, developmental, and new student experience courses and co-curricular activities. The REACH HIGHER program is based on piloted learning strategies that have proven successful for developmental education students. These pilot strategies have resulted in increased college credit hour attainment, higher persistence rates, and attainment of good academic standing. Strategies will be used such as providing students with a mapped-out first year experience schedule based on LinCed courses. SSS participants will be on target to achieve 21 college credits and complete their developmental education courses in one year. Strong co-curricular activities will be provided throughout the SSS participants' academic coursework leading to their graduation and transfer to four-year college and universities.

UCF and Valencia College together propose the T-STEM Knights program that will bring the highly successful EXCEL model to Valencia's West Campus. The goal of this project is to design, develop, and test a model that increases the graduation rates of transfer students in STEM. The Valencia T-STEM Knights program will target Valencia College STEM majors who place into Intermediate or College Algebra or higher, build a community using social media and offering virtual tutoring and advising, and reinforce curriculum alignment in the gateway math courses through a "grow your own faculty" concept. The UCF T-STEM Knights program will target transfers who enter UCF declared as STEM and still require math courses; the project will offer to these students the STEM seminar course as a transition course. Both programs will offer undergraduate research experiences (URE)/Internship experiences, once students matriculate into UCF, as several studies have shown that UREs lead to increased proficiency in skill sets, engagement in discipline and improved speaking and communication skills which ultimately will strengthen their STEM workforce readiness.	\$300,000	\$0.00	Pending
