<p>USA Funds Financial Literacy Education Program</p> <p>Submitted: April 1, 2013</p>	<p>Valencia has received this funding for the last two years to support the Learning Ambassador Peer Mentoring program. The project will continue the activities in the past years, but will also address the sustainability of the project. The momentum gained over the last three years of funding has provided Valencia with recognition and visibility in the financial literacy education arena. The project will support student scholarships for the Ambassadors, student and staff travel, consultant training for faculty to integrate financial literacy into their curriculum, printing and copying, supplies and materials, and providing Skillshops to students.</p>	<p>\$25,000</p>	<p>None</p>	<p>Pending</p>
<p>Florida Department of Education</p> <p>2+2 Partnerships Incentive Funding</p>	<p>Specific Appropriation 110B of the 2012-13 General Appropriations Act provides \$3 million to support 2+2 partnership articulation agreements. Of this amount, \$2,250,000 is appropriated for eligible public colleges and public universities with partnership articulation agreements to provide 2+2 baccalaureate degree programs at a college during the 2012-13 academic year. The remaining \$750,000 is appropriated for eligible public colleges and public universities to develop new 2+2 partnership agreements for programs offered at a college during the 2012-13 and 2013-14 academic years. Both the college and the state university are eligible to receive an equal share of funding for the 2+2 partnership articulation agreements. For the purposes of the funding distribution process, the \$2,250,000 distribution will be referred to as the "Existing 2+2 Partnerships" and the \$750,000 distribution will be referred to as the "Incentive for New 2+2 Partnerships."</p> <p>Valencia applied in both the existing and new 2+2 partnership categories. The UCF regional partnership office provided data supporting the application. The \$2,062,882 allocation to Valencia is contingent on Florida's award from the Federal allocation.
