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What is General Education?

- a program of education intended to
 - develop students' general knowledge,
 rather than training them to be specialists
 - transmit a common cultural heritage
 - develop critical thinking skills
 - develop well rounded students
 - reinforce basic skills



Gen Ed and Accreditation

- SACS Core Requirement 2.7.3 In each undergraduate degree program, the institution requires the successful completion of a general education component at the collegiate level that
 - (1) is a substantial component of each undergraduate degree,
 - (2) ensures breadth of knowledge, and
 - (3) is based on a coherent rationale.
- For degree completion in associate programs, the component constitutes a minimum of 15 semester hours or the equivalent; for baccalaureate programs, a minimum of 30 semester hours or the equivalent.
- These credit hours are to be drawn from and include at least one course from each of the following areas: humanities/fine arts; social/behavioral sciences; and natural science/mathematics

House Bill 7135- March 2012

- Reduced Gen Ed from 36 to 30 hours
- Required up to 5 common core courses in each Gen Ed area
- Required all institutions to offer and accept all courses in the common core
- Required an implementation date of August 2014/2015

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Amendments to House Bill 7135 through Senate Bill 1720

- To increase the Gen Ed credit hours back to 36
- To change the implementation date to 2015/2016
- To add, if needed, additional core options to Gen Ed (this is new)
- To require all institutions to accept the core, but not require them to offer all courses
- To have a provision for advanced level courses within the core options
