 - Compliance with the 45-day posting policy




Textbook And instructional Materials Costs

- The average student in the United States pays \$1200 a year for instructional materials
- 64 percent of students at some point have not bought a textbook because of the cost
- Cost of textbooks influences 48 percent of students when they choose which course or how many courses to take in any given semester



Cost Savings in Dollars



Cost Savings by Faculty and Deans

- Selecting books that can be used for multiple classes
- Developing self-created instructional materials
- Using free texts from on-line sources
- Curating free content from a variety of sources
- Providing choices e-books and textbook rentals



Cost Savings by the Bookstore

- Bulk purchases of texts
- Accepting lower margins on high cost textbooks
- Resale of books
- Acquiring used books to sell to students
- Negotiating with publishers
