## The Arts & Culture Industry in Central Florida

- \$264 Million generated by arts and cultural organizations and their audiences in direct economic activity.
- The Creative industries account for 34,711 registered jobs including:
  - Museums
  - Performing Arts
  - Visual Arts
  - Film, Radio, and TV
  - Design and Publishing
  - Arts Schools and Service
  - Theme Parks

## Arts & Entertainment at Valencia

- 9 Academic degree programs
- Performing Arts Center, Black Box Theater, Anita S. Wooten East Campus Gallery
- 9500 student enrollments annually
- 467 graduates of Technical Certificates and AS degree programs (2014-2015)
- 75+ events and performances annually (generates an average of \$35,000 in annual revenue)
- 10,000+ arts patrons served annually (has increased by 40% over the last five years!)
- 150+ middle and high school summer campers

#### Enrollment & Program Growth

- Course level growth in 2015-2016 due to State approved General Education classes
  - MUL1010 (Music Appreciation) annual enrollment increased by 30%
  - THE1000 (Introduction to Theater) annual enrollment increased by 69%
- Program level growth
  - Dance advanced level cohort increased from Fall 2014 to Fall 2015 by 25%
  - Film advanced level cohort increased from Fall 2015 to Fall 2016 by 30%
  - Sound & Music Technology graduates are expected to double by 2020
