RE: LETTER OF INTENT – BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

Valencia currently has a strong and vibrant Nursing Program leading to an Associate of Science degree, with an enrollment of 525 students each semester. The demand for qualified nurses who have earned a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree (BSN) is rising, and The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Initiative on the Future of Nursing, a joint enterprise with the Institute of Medicine, has determined that hospitals should increase the proportion of employed RNs with a BSN to 80% by 2020.

Both nationally and regionally in this career field there is a shortage of qualified Registered Nurses. Region 12 (our area) now has an estimated 2,066 nursing related jobs. In the next eight years economic projections predict 26.7% job growth just in Registered Nurse occupation (Source: DEO, LMI).

The College has both strong student interest and strong documented industry support for offering a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. In addition, the College received strong support from other higher education institutions with no expressions of concern following their receipt of formal notification of Valencia's interest in offering this program of study.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

The President recommends that the District Board of Trustees approve the College's intent to develop appropriate curriculum to submit to the State Board of Education for approval, and then to submit to the Southern Association of Schools and Colleges for approval, to offer the Bachelor of Science in Nursing.
