

Winter Park Campus Authors Win National Prizes, Publish Books

Professor Ilyse Kusnetz-

- Winner of the T.S. Eliot Prize for Poetry for her collection, *Small Hours* (Trumansburg State Press, 2014)
- Professor Cate McGowan-
 - Winner of the Moon City Short Fiction Award for her story collection, *True Places Never Are* (Moon City Press, 2015)

Brian Turner, Our Third Reader, Renowned Author and Speaker

Featured often on NPR, Turner's work has been published in *Harper's Magazine*, *National Geographic*, *The New York Times, Poetry Daily, Shortlist* (UK), and other journals, as well as in the *Voices in Wartime Anthology* published in conjunction with the feature-length documentary film of the same name.

Turner was also featured in the Academy Award-nominated film *Operation Homecoming*, a unique documentary that explores the firsthand accounts of American service members through their own words.

Two poetry collections:

- Here, Bullet, which won the 2005 Beatrice Hawley Award, the New York Times "Editor's Choice" selection, the 2006 PEN Center USA "Best in the West" award, and the 2007 Poets Prize, among others;
- *Phantom Noise*, which was shortlisted for the 2010 T.S. Eliot Prize in Poetry.

Memoir: My Life as a Foreign Country

- Powell's Best Nonfiction of 2014 list.
- Reveals Turner's experience of one soldier in one recent war—the preparations, actions, homecomings, and
 infinite aftermath—but then explodes from those narrow limits. Turner's account combines recollection and
 imagination and leaps centuries and continents to seek parallels in the histories of other men.

In 2009, Turner was selected as one of fifty United States Artists Fellows. He traveled extensively with an Amy Lowell Poetry Traveling Scholarship, and to Japan in 2012 with a US-Japan Friendship Commission Fellowship. His poems have been published and translated into more than fifteen languages.

Turner served seven years in the US Army, including one year as an infantry team leader in Iraq with the 3rd Stryker Brigade Combat Team, 2nd Infantry Division. Before that, he was deployed to Bosnia-Herzegovina in 1999-2000 with the 10th Mountain Division.




