### ANNUAL HIGH SCHOOL FEEDBACK REPORT: SERVICE DISTRICT

### Term 201710 (Fall 2016)

As part of its learning-centered orientation, Valencia College provides its public-school district partners this report addressing selected performance elements of current dual-enrolled students, previous year high school graduates, former Career Pathways students, and high school alumni who have also graduated from Valencia. This report provides information on public high school graduates in Orange and Osceola counties.

### **Executive Summary: Service District**

### **Dual-enrolled Students**

During Term 201710 (Fall 2016), there were **2,425 dual-enrolled students** from the Valencia's service district, comprised of Orange and Osceola Counties. These students simultaneously receive high school and college credit.

### **Previous Year High School Graduates (PYHSGs)**

In Term 201710 (Fall 2016), of Valencia's service district previous year high school graduates,

- **4,614** enrolled at Valencia.
- **3,630** were **first-time-in-college (FTIC)** students; that is, they had no previous college credit of any kind. This figure excludes graduates who were dual-enrolled as high school students.
- 99 participated in Valencia's Honors Program.
- 1,000 received scholarships at Valencia.
- 603 were named to the President's Honor List; 438 were named to the Dean's Honor List.
- 2,261 participated in Career Pathways while in high school.
- 58.9% of the service area's FTIC, PYHSGs took placement tests prior to entering Valencia.
  - 41.7% were mandated into at least one developmental education course.
    - 27.0% placed into reading; 23.2% placed into writing; and 28.9% placed into mathematics.
- **58.3%** of PYHSGs were not required to take developmental education courses.
- **59.8%** of **Out of District & InDistrict, NonPublic HS students FTIC, PYHSGs** took **placement tests** prior to entering Valencia. Of these students,
  - 44.4% were required to take at least one developmental education course.
    - 29.7% placed into reading; 24.6% placed into writing; and 32.9% placed into mathematics.
  - **55.6**% of Out of District & InDistrict, NonPublic HS students **were not required** to take a developmental education course.
- 81.0% of the Service District's PYHSGs who began classes in Fall 2016 returned to Valencia in Spring 2017.

### Valencia Attendance (through December 2016)

Of all students attending Valencia College,

- 207,917 students graduated from Orange and Osceola County public high schools since 1967.
- 39,027 of these public high school graduates attended Valencia since Fall 2012.

### Valencia Graduates (through December 2016)

Of all students receiving degrees at Valencia College,

- 81,341 Orange and Osceola public high school graduates earned degrees since 1967.
- 26,426 Orange and Osceola public high school graduates earned degrees since Fall 2012.

### **Dual-enrolled Students**

Dual-enrolled students are those who have not graduated from high school, have been accepted into the Dual Enrollment program, and who are simultaneously receiving college and high school credit. Dual-enrolled students may be members of a class taught in a high school in the service district or may be enrolled in a course on a Valencia campus with the approval of the Dual Enrollment Office. Dual-enrolled students are either shown as FTAV (First-Time-at-Valencia) or Continuing Dual-enrolled, signifying that the student is still enrolled in high school, but has completed a dual-enrolled course in a previous semester.

### **Previous Year High School Graduates**

In Term 201710 (Fall 2016), **4,614** previous year high school graduates from public high schools in Orange and Osceola counties enrolled and attended Valencia. Most were first-time-in-college and some had completed dual-enrolled courses prior to high school graduation. FTICs (First-time-in-college) are FTAV (First-Time-at-Valencia), have no transfer credits, no transfer or transient status, and are not Dual-Enrolled/Early Admission/Early Enrollment

FTIC DE (Former Dual Enr) are dual-enrolled students as indicated by their admission status field, and who have a high school graduation date within the previous 95 days of the beginning date of the term. As such, they are considered to be in their first term at Valencia since their recent high school graduation.

Returners are all others who have come back for subsequent terms at Valencia College.

### **Honors Program Participation**

A total of **99** previous year high school graduates from Valencia's service district were enrolled in Valencia's Honors Programs during the Fall 2016 term. The table below shows the breakout by county.

### **President's and Dean's Honor Lists**

Previous year high school graduates from the service district were recognized for their academic achievement by being named to the President's Honor List with a grade point average of 3.75 and above or to the Dean's Honor List with a grade point average of 3.25 to 3.74. Full-time students are eligible for the President's or Dean's Honor Lists upon completion of 12 credit hours of college-level work during a term. Part-time students are eligible for honors recognition after completing increments of 12 credit hours of college-level work over multiple terms.

### **Remediation Report (Mandate Rates)**

When previous year high school graduates apply for admission as degree-seekers, they take Florida's Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.) required by the State of Florida, or they present an ACT or SAT score. These test scores place the student into either developmental education or college-level courses in English, reading, or mathematics. The developmental education course may be at the first or second level; generally, the first level is for up to ninth grade work, while the second level is for tenth- to twelfth-grade work. Remediation rates are computed for previous year high school graduates (PYHSGs) who are first-time-in-college degree seekers. Placement levels for previous year high school graduates from Orange County schools are shown below.

### **College-Ready Students (No Mandates)**

One measure of college readiness is when the student is exempt from taking developmental education courses by virtue of scoring above certain scores on the ACT, the SAT, or Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.). The number of students scoring above the cut scores for English, reading, and mathematics is shown below. The following table counts all previous year high school graduates (PYHSGs) enrolled in Term 201710 (Fall 2016) regardless of whether the fall term was their first term of enrollment.

### **Career Pathways Program**

The Career Pathways (formerly Tech Prep) program provides high school students an opportunity to receive college credit for knowledge gained in workforce-related programs. Students participate in a number of experiences in and out of class to gain experience in applying their academic skills to the world of work. Career Pathways experience prepares high school students for college and further workforce education. Career Pathways student enrollment from Orange and Osceola County high schools is shown below.
