

AS Transfer Students

The Legal Studies Department has an entered into an Articulation Agreement with Valencia College. Pursuant to terms of the Articulation Agreement, the Legal Studies Department will permit Valencia College students transferring to UCF with an AS in Paralegal Studies to satisfy <u>no more than nine (9) hours</u> of coursework in the major with lower division PLA course substitutions. Below is an explanation of the <u>nine (9) credits</u> of substitution. Grades of "D" do not transfer into the major.

PLA Electives

Students are **REQUIRED** to complete <u>thirty-three (33) hours</u> of Legal Studies (PLA) Electives. The Legal Studies Department will permit <u>no more than six (6) hours</u> of substitutions from students' lower division coursework towards the PLA Elective requirement.
