Q: How can you save on books?

A: Ask your professor or consult your syllabus to know if you really need the book, or if you just need copies of certain sections. If books are needed, the links below can help.

Bookfinder.com: This site will help you compare prices between different sellers and pick the cheapest books! Other sites that can help you save money are: Amazon.com and Cheag.com.

Books can also be rented. You do not have to buy the book if you will never use it again. If you decide to buy it, remember to look into used versions.
