Italics or Quotes?

Whether to italicize or use quotation marks around a title depends on the style guide you're using: MLA, APA, Chicago, or AP. Most formatting rules are based on the style guide, rather than being always true.

When to Underline

Underlining is a way of showing something is italicized when italics are not an option (like when hand-writing). This won't come up very often, so you generally won't have a reason to use underlining.
