


Example: Periodical Article



First in-text citation: Alison Cowan explains "text of quotation." **Subsequent** citations: Cowan states "text of quotation." OR

"Text of quotation" (Cowan).

Example: Journal Article - Two Authors - With Digital Object Identifier (DOI)




First In-text citation: Stephan Fischer and Joachim G. Frommen explain "text of quotation" (293). **Subsequent** citations: Fischer and Frommen recount "text of quotation" (293).

OR

"Text of quotation" (Lynn and Miller 293).

Example: Book Online - Chapter - Two Authors



First in-text citation: Suzie Hesook Kim and Bjorn Sjostrom explain "text of quotation" (190). **Subsequent** citations: Kim and Sjostrom relate "text of quotation" (190). OR

"Text of quotation" (Kim and Sjostrom 190).
